Academic excellence meets location

Welcome to London, a world-leading financial centre immersed in history and culture.



An inspiring place to live and learn, London has a vast

array of parkland, landmarks and museums. It is also a diverse and welcoming city with people of more than 270 nationalities calling London home.

Britain's business and industry hub

London is home to 70 FTSE 100-listed companies and some 400 Fortune 500 companies – which makes it the perfect location for business students. The campus sits on the edge of London's Square Mile, home to thousands of national and international businesses.

The green capital

London is one of the greenest capitals in the world with more than 3,000 parks and open spaces. If you've got a free afternoon and the sun's shining, pack a picnic and check out the panoramic views from Primrose Hill, or relax with a trendy crowd on London Fields or Victoria Park.

Sporting heroes

The Queen Elizabeth Olympic Park is home to a variety of world-class sports facilities. For those who prefer to spectate, London has more than 40 football teams, from Premiership stars to local heroes. There's cricket at Lords, and you can pop to Wimbledon for tennis with strawberries and cream.



Free London fun

One of the best things about studying in London is just how much fun you can have on a small budget. There are numerous free galleries and museums, alongside a number of festivals which are either free or heavily discounted for students. Whatever you do, don't forget to set a calendar update for Notting Hill Carnival, the Totally Thames Festival, and of course, Chinese New Year – London's Chinatown holds the biggest celebrations outside of Asia!

Explore London

As Samuel Johnson once said:

"...when a man is tired of London, he is tired of life; for there is in London all that life can afford."

Arts and culture

Explore world-famous museums and galleries for free! Must-sees include Tate Modern, the British Museum, the National Portrait Gallery and the Science Museum. Stand face-to-face with a T-Rex at the Natural History Museum, see the best new contemporary art at The Saatchi Gallery in Sloane Square, or head to the British Library to see the Magna Carta first hand.

Theatre and music

Experience authentic Shakespearean plays at the Globe Theatre, or take in the big name shows in the West End. Be part of the Proms at Albert Hall, support up-and-coming acts in local bars, listen to jazz at Ronnie Scott's, or dance at 1,000ft at the Shard's silent disco. There's truly something for everyone!

Food and drink

Love eating out? You'll love London. From quirky pop-ups to Michelin star restaurants, there are tasty options. The cuisine is as diverse as the people who call London home. You can eat your way around the globe: bagels on Brick Lane for breakfast; world-class dim sum in Chinatown for lunch; Brazilian BBQ for dinner; Sri Lankan street snacks for supper; a curry if you're still hungry, the list is never ending.

Shopping

In London, there are shopping opportunities to suit every taste and budget, from chic boutiques to brilliant bargains. Oxford Street and the Westfield Shopping Centres are perfect for high street shopping, while high end boutiques include Harrods, Liberty and Selfridges. For vintage, head to Brick Lane or Camden Market.















Local London

With our campus in the coolest part of town, it's impossible not to have fun.

Newcastle University London sits between the Square Mile, the City's main business district and Shoreditch, a buzzing area alive with fashionable shops and creative people.



Eating and drinking

Food Village on Shoreditch High Street offers everything from burritos to steak sandwiches, while Spitalfields, Petticoat Lane and Brick Lane markets also sell a range of international cuisines. Meanwhile, students who are lucky enough to book a table at Sushi Samba can experience the best of London's fine dining scene.



Arts: in and outdoors

Here, art isn't just confined to galleries and museums, such as the outstanding Whitechapel Gallery and the interactive Red Gallery. Take a stroll to Shoreditch from Brick Lane on the trail of Instagram-worthy graffiti, and you might even spot a famous Banksy!



Music and nightlife

Close to campus, the Magic Roundabout is one of London's most unique live music venues, accessible via a secret staircase and located in the middle of Old Street roundabout. Big name acts like Florence and the Machine are hosted at The Macbeth, while The Old Blue Last plays upcoming music acts.



Retail therapy

Fed up with samey high street shopping? You'll love Shoreditch, known for its variety of vintage stores. BOXPARK and Redchurch Street are packed with boutiques. You can also head to Columbia Road, which transforms into an oasis of foliage and flowers every Sunday.



An inspirational skyline

The Square Mile is packed with inspirational modern buildings. Spot the 'Cheese Grater', and perhaps even spend your work placement in Lord Norman Foster's iconic Gherkin. For a glimpse into the city's rich history, the Tower of London (home to the Crown Jewels), is just a 20 minute walk away.



Sport

If you love football, you'll love Shoreditch Lucozade Powerleague. The 13 outdoor pitches are located opposite Shoreditch High Street overground station.

Explore London



The City of London is one of the most inspiring places in the world to live and learn and our campus is either in walking distance, or just a few tube stops away from all of the major attractions. We are just a five-minute walk from Liverpool Street Station in Zone 1, where you can hop on four different underground lines and National Rail services. 

Newcastle University London has excellent transport links nearby. Newcastle is three hours by train from London King's Cross. At the weekend it's also easy to explore other parts of the UK, like Brighton, Oxford, even scenic Cornwall. You can also visit other European cities including Paris, Brussels and Lille using the Eurostar train based at St Pancras. London is also well connected by air, with major international airports within easy reach.









Campus

A warm welcome meets great facilities

The Newcastle University London campus building is a sleek, purpose-built building on Middlesex Street, minutes from Liverpool Street Station.





First-rate facilities

You'll work towards your degree in a modern, high-quality learning environment. It's a great space, designed to help you focus on achieving your full potential. We're well equipped with study pods for quiet learning, multi-purpose lecture theatres and seminar rooms complete with interactive whiteboards. These flexible spaces support lectures, practical sessions, seminars and tutorials. You'll also benefit from high-quality IT and e-learning resources, as well as Bloomberg terminals to give you hands on practical experience of financial trading.

When it's time for a break, there are plenty of social spaces too. If you're feeling hungry, our campus café serves a range of snacks and drinks, and we also have a number of breakout areas including table tennis facilities. There are also plenty of student hangouts close to the campus, including cafés, restaurants and bars.

The Learning Resource Centre

For all our students, our well-equipped Learning Resource Centre is the place to go for learning materials. These include core textbooks, DVDs. CDs and newspapers, as well as printing, copying and scanning facilities. You'll also have access to Newcastle University's wealth of online learning resources, including over six million ebooks and electronic journals. Best of all, our experienced and friendly team are on hand to help you make the most of the resources available.

Master's suite for postgraduate students

The master's suite is a dedicated area for postgraduate students to complete assignments and unwind in between lectures. It's a pleasant, quiet, independent study space, with IT facilities.

Modern IT facilities and e-resources

Students have full access to on-campus IT facilities and can take advantage of the free wireless internet available. Additional study resources include a virtual learning environment, giving access to reading lists, programme handouts, online assessment and discussions. We also provide a supportive online learning system if English isn't your first language.

Gym facilities

Look after your body as well as your mind by joining either the Fitness First gym next door to our campus, or the University of London Student Central gym and pool facilities just a few tube stops away. Students enjoy discounted membership rates, and you can make the most of facilities including a cardio theatre, free weights, spin studio and personal trainers.

Your Career

Careers Service

Newcastle University's Careers Service is multi-award winning. The team offer advice and support for students seeking a graduate career, starting a business or embarking on further study. Dedicated staff will help you plan your career, market your skills, build contacts and find jobs. You can also attend the 'Gain a Global Advantage' day, an afternoon of inspiring talks, interactive workshops and networking opportunities with prestigious employers – all with a global focus.

Masterclasses

Top business leaders give free weekly masterclass talks to our students. Previous speakers have included the Head of Luxury and Fashion, the London Evening Standard, former House of Fraser CEO, the former CEO of Granada Group, the director of Daytime and Lifestyle at ITV Content, the former Procter & Gamble global senior executive, and the co-founder of Leaderscape. Use the sessions as an opportunity to find out the secrets of their success!

Public debate series

Regular public debates help you stay well-informed. They're free to attend, and previous events have focused on the EU referendum, corruption in sports and Lord Allen of Kensington's career.

Alumni events

Many Newcastle University graduates occupy senior roles across London. We hold regular networking events and welcome successful professionals to meet our current students. Connecting with alumni is a great way to potentially further your career.

Work placements and internships

Supplement your studies and gain invaluable real-world experience by taking part in a placement as part of your degree. We offer everything from one year placements for our undergraduate students, to shorter placements for our postgraduate and foundation students. Options can include a three-month internship - sponsored by Santander - to an exciting range of shorter CV-enhancing placements. We have dedicated support to help you find a placement, and have secured a number of internships exclusively for Newcastle University London students.

Group projects – A great way to showcase skills, such as time management, team working, budgeting, presentation and leadership skills, as you put theory to work in a small team. Past student projects have included a live challenge at Spitalfields market and a real business simulation.

Individual assignments – A chance to let your personal abilities really shine, working on a practical project set by a well-known businesses. Previous students have, for example, written case studies on organisations such as Marco Pierre White and Zaha Hadid Architects.

Student Support

Supporting you to achieve your ambitions

Dedicated services to help you make the most of your education



Whether it's your first time living away from home, you're joining us from a different country or you're returning to education from the world of work, we offer a full suite of support services to help you take control of your education and make the most of your university experience.

Welcome Desk

The Welcome Desk is the hub of campus activity, and is the first stop for all students needing to access our support services. Throughout the year, our friendly Student Support Services team is on-hand to provide help and advice on all aspects of student life. These include academic support, student welfare, accommodation and finance, as well as visa and immigration advice for international students.

The Welcome Desk is open throughout the day Monday-Friday. We also offer a 24-hour phone number that students can call in the event of an emergency.

Academic support

Tutors and peer mentors provide support from an academic perspective. You'll be assigned a personal tutor to help you with your academic development. Turn to them for practical advice and guidance on issues such as preparing for exams and helping to signpost relevant careers and skills development. If you're feeling stressed or worried they can help you balance your study and personal life too.

Student welfare

If you'd prefer to talk in complete confidence, you can also book an appointment with our welfare adviser to discuss any concerns or issues.

Induction week

During induction week, you're invited to take part in a full orientation programme. It's designed to help you settle in before your course starts, and includes:

- A formal welcome to the University
- An introduction to your course lecturers and/or teachers
- An introduction to Student Support Services
- A tour of the learning and teaching facilities
- An optional tour of the local area
- Help and advice on topics such as how to register at a local doctor's surgery or open a bank account

If you do need a visa, the Visa Team here at Newcastle University London can provide assistance with immigration questions, like applying to renew your student visa, rules for working in the UK during and after your studies. Contact the team before you arrive in the UK by emailing newcastlelondon@ncl.ac.uk, or visit the Welcome Desk.

English language requirements

If English isn't your first language, we'll ask for evidence of your proficiency as part of your application:

- Undergraduate and postgraduate MSc students - IELTS score of 6.5 or equivalent*
- PhD students IELTS score of 7.0 or equivalent
- University preparation programmes IELTS score of 5.5 or equivalent*
- * These may vary between courses. Always check specific course pages online for the most up to date entrance requirements.

If you don't meet the requirements yet, it's worth considering the Pre-Sessional English programme. For more information, visit page 51.

Integrated Undergraduate Programme**

International students that do not meet the academic requirements of our undergraduate degrees can study an Integrated Undergraduate Programme. It is a four-year course (or five for students that carry out a work placement as part of their degree), combining an International Foundation in Business with an undergraduate degree, and only one visa is required for the duration of the course.

Support for international students

Our friendly student support and academic teams are here to help you settle into your new life in London and we're confident you'll soon feel at home.

Welcome week

The support starts as soon as you arrive. Once you've unpacked, welcome week begins. This full orientation programme includes:

- Registration
- Formal welcome to the university
- Help opening a bank account
- A trip to collect your biometric residence permit
- City tour
- Advice on how to register with the police
- The all-important social programme there's lots of fun planned, from boat trips to parties. Find out more on page 27.

Academic support

Every new student is assigned a personal tutor a member of the academic team you can talk to about how your studies are progressing. You'll be introduced during your first week of studies, and will be invited to meet regularly:

- International Foundation students meet with their personal tutor once a term
- All other courses meet with their personal tutor at least twice in the first semester, then once per semester thereafter

On-campus English language assessment and support

We ask most international students to take a short English language assessment upon arrival to identify any additional language support you might need.

If you've achieved a high IELTS score (or equivalent), or you're joining us from a country where English is widely used, you may be exempt from the test. Find out more at http://go.ncl.ac.uk/london/uela

If you're not a native English speaker or studying an English language course, we offer up to 10 hours of free in-sessional English classes per week and opportunities for one-to-one tutorials. These are designed to help you improve your academic writing, listening, speaking, pronunciation and grammar skills.

Your personalised London guide

Before you join us, you'll receive a Newcastle University London Students' Union (NUSU) Connections survey. It's a great way to make new friends before term even starts: chat and get to know each other online, so when you arrive on campus and meet face-to-face you'll feel more at home from day one.



The UK's 2016 EU referendum returned a 'leave' vote and the process for the UK leaving the EU has begun. The UK is expected to leave the EU in 2019. While this decision will have some consequences, no major changes will take place immediately and EU students entering Newcastle University in 2018 will continue to pay the UK (home) rate of fees.






In line with UK government (the Home Office) regulations, all students seeking admission to Newcastle University London must be competent in English Language. For qualifications at NQF level 6 (degree level) or above this must be at a minimum of level B2 on the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR) in each of the four components of language learning (reading, writing, speaking and listening). IELTS 5.5 is deemed to demonstrate B2 level competence.

Under no circumstances will a student with an overall level of English Language below IELTS 5.5, or with a reading, writing, speaking or listening score below IELTS 5.5, be given admission to a full degree programme at Newcastle University London.
