SCHOOL OF ARTS AND SCIENCES

BACHELOR OF ARTS

University Transfer or Collaborative Degree

Length

4 years; transfer to a University after 2 years at RDC. BA Psychology and Sociology majors can complete all 4 years at RDC, in collaboration with the University of Calgary. See majors section below.

With a Bachelor of Arts degree, you will cultivate skills in critical thinking and communication, while unleashing your creativity to help affect change in our society. Career options may include everything from politics to government work, research services to community development. Previous students have worked on creating awareness and solutions for poverty and homelessness, student resilience and gender and domestic violence.

- At least 19 years of age
- Out of high school for one full year before program starts

BACHELOR OF SCIENCE

University Transfer or Collaborative Degree

Length

4 years; transfer after 1 or 2 years at RDC (depending on major). BSc Psychology majors can complete all 4 years at RDC, in collaboration with the University of Calgary. See majors section below.

Studying the sciences gives you the foundational skills to be successful in any BSc degree, while allowing you to apply the knowledge you learn to the world around you. Students at RDC can also begin working towards professional programs, such as Medical and Veterinary school, while learning foundational science and research skills.

BACHELOR OF SCIENCE

University Transfer Degree

Length

4 years; 1 year at RDC, 3 years at U of A or other institution

Engineering mixes creativity with scientific knowledge in order to generate new processes and products to improve both society and quality of life. The scope of Engineering is broad and applicable to every part of society.

Admission Requirements

- Minimum average of 65%
- Minimum 60% in Math 30-1 and Math 31
- Minimum 50% in Chemistry 30, ELA 30-1 and Physics 30

Note: Admission is offered on a competitive basis based on GPA ranking.

Transfer Opportunities

The courses in this program can be transferred in full to University of Alberta. The program is also highly transferable to many other institutions in Western Canada, and the program can be tailored for students who may wish to transfer to an institution other than the University of Alberta.

JUSTICE STUDIES DIPLOMA

Length

2 years at RDC

Through Justice Studies, students will gain an understanding of the elements of the justice system in Canada, how those elements relate to each other, and how the system works at the local, provincial/territorial, and federal levels. Students will research and understand the justice sector through professional seminars and a practicum experience.

Admission Requirements

- Minimum 60% in ELA 30-1
- Minimum 60% in one course from group A (see page 07 for full course list)

The Justice Studies program recognizes the need to facilitate access to post-secondary education for both Indigenous and non-Indigenous learners.

To facilitate greater participation of Indigenous learners, the Justice Studies program has designated 10% of seats for qualified applicants who are Status Indian/First Nations, Non-status Indian/ First Nations, Metis, or Inuit. After June 1 of each year, any such designated seats which have not been taken by Indigenous learners meeting admission requirements, and applying under this provision, will be released to qualified applicants on the waitlist.

Transfer Opportunities

Students who complete the Justice Studies Diploma with a GPA average of 3.0 are eligible to transfer the diploma as 60 credits towards Royal Roads University's Bachelor of Arts in Justice Studies.

MEDIA STUDIES & PROFESSIONAL COMMUNICATION DIPLOMA

Length

2 years at RDC

Students will study how mass media such as television, advertising, and even video games influence, and are influenced by, society. Courses and topics include Social Media, Marketing & Branding, Project Management, Entrepreneurship and Mass Communication in Canada. The program mixes applied learning and theoretical knowledge, and students gain workplace experience via practicum placement in their second year.

Admission Requirements

- Minimum 50% in ELA 30-1
- Minimum 50% in one course from group A or C (see page 07 for full course list)

Note: Students admitted to the program based on successful completion of one year of full-time academic study at the post-secondary level, but without ELA 30-1 or equivalent, will need to complete English upgrading during their first year of admission

Transfer Opportunities

Students who have completed Red Deer College's Media Studies & Professional Communication twoyear diploma will be eligible for 60 credits towards Athabasca University's Bachelor of Professional Arts -Communication Studies. Additional transfer opportunities exist depending on career goals. The diploma also transfers as 60 credits towards Royal Roads University's Bachelor of Arts in Professional Communication if graduates receive a cumulative GPA average of 3.0. Length

Varies

Open Studies allows students to start their post-secondary education, while still finalizing the direction they want to go. It is a great fit for students who may be missing an admission requirement for their goal program, as students can mix both upgrading and postsecondary courses.

Admission Requirements

- High school diploma

- Minimum 50% in ELA 30-1 or 30-2
- Minimum 50% in three courses from group A, B or C
- Minimum 50% in one additional course from group A, B, C or D (see page 07 for full course list)

Mature Student

- Out of high school at least one full year before the program starts
- Minimum 50% in ELA 30-1 or ELA 30-2

SOCIAL WORK DIPLOMA 🚾

Length

2 years at RDC

The Social Work program prepares students for employment as social workers. Within the scope of their work, graduates may choose to pursue careers that deal directly and indirectly with child neglect, foster care, juvenile offenders, family conflict and individual emotional problems. The program includes multiple field work opportunities, allowing students to gain employment experience and skills.

Admission Requirements

- High School Diploma
- Minimum 50% in ELA 30-1 and Social Studies 30-1

Mature Student

 Minimum 50% in ELA 30-1 or ELA 30-2

OR

 Minimum score of 80 on the Reading component, 86 on the Sentence component and 5 on the written essay component of the College Board Placement Test

All applicants will be required to complete a minimum of 100 hours of volunteer or employment experience, provide references and complete a personal questionnaire, as well as undergo an interview with the Social Work department. Length

1 year at RDC

This program provides students with the software training to be competitive in a continuously changing field. The 120-hour practicum placement offers an opportunity to combine your newly developed skills with on-the-job training.

Admission Requirements

- Minimum 50% in ELA 30-1 or 65% in ELA 30-2 or entrance exam available
- Police Information Check may be required

Transfer Opportunities

The Administrative Professional Certificate transfers to all Office Administration Diploma programs at Colleges in Alberta. Completion of the Administrative Professional Certificate grants 10 credits (3 courses) towards the Management Certificate. Admission Requirements

BACHELOR OF COMMERCE oc

University Transfer Degree

Length

4 years; transfer to a University after 1 or 2 years at Red Deer College or complete the Bachelor of Business Administration degree at RDC

This university transfer program will provide you with fundamental business principles, as well as touch on the social sciences needed to be competitive in today's work force.

Admission Requirements

- Minimum average of 60% with no mark below 50% in ELA 30-1 and Mathematics 30-1

Transfer Opportunities

- 1 year at RDC + 3 years at the University of Calgary
- 2 years at RDC + 2 years at most universities

BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION DIPLOMA 🚾 💿

Length

2 years at RDC

The program prepares you for a career in both small and large companies, private business or public sector organizations. There are five majors offered: accounting, financial services, general management, human resources and marketing. You will study current industry practice while gaining practical experience and professional development opportunities.

Admission Requirements

Students must meet one of the following requirements:

- Minimum average of 60% with no mark below 50% in ELA 30-1 and Math 30-1
- Minimum average of 65% with no mark below 50% in ELA 30-2 and Math 30-2
- Minimum average of 62.5% with no mark below 50% in one of the following combinations: ELA 30-1 and Math 30-2 or ELA 30-2 and Math 30-1
- Successful completion of RDC's Management Certificate

Transfer Opportunities

Length

16 months; Fall term intake

Designed for diploma or degree holders currently working within the health care sector, the program applies foundational business concepts to the challenges faced by both public and private health care organizations.

- Post-secondary diploma or degree, or equivalent, in a health-related field

- A minimum of 50% in ELA 30-1 or 65% in ELA 30-2, or entrance exam available

MANAGEMENT CERTIFICATE CC •

Length

1 year at RDC

The management certificate can be tailored to suit your needs and area of interest; acquire skills in accounting, entrepreneurship, marketing or project management. Get your start on the managerial position you are looking for.

Admission Requirements

Students must meet one of the following requirements:

- Minimum average of 60% with no mark below 50% in ELA 30-1 and Math 30-1
- Minimum average of 65% with no mark below 50% in ELA 30-2 and Math 30-2
- Minimum average of 62.5% with no mark below 50% in one of the following combinations: ELA 30-1 and Math 30-2 OR ELA 30-2 and Math 30-1
- Entrance Exam Available

Transfer Opportunities

Students wanting to advance their studies in business administration are able to apply the Management Certificate courses to the two-year Business Administration Diploma. However, course selection should be given careful consideration as part of the overall planning for the Management Certificate. Students who have completed the Management Certificate program and successfully fulfill the graduation requirement for the Business Administration Diploma will be granted the Business Administration Diploma only.

Applied Degree

Length

4 years at RDC

With a focus in 3D animation and visual effects, you will develop artistic foundations and apply these to 3D animation processes using industry-relevant software. You will be introduced early to the concepts of storyboarding, layout, colour and light, digital sculpting, digital texture painting, compositing, and visual effects. You will be well-prepared for an exciting career in the fast-paced animation industry!

Admission Requirements

- Minimum 60% in ELA 30-1
- Minimum 50% in one course from group A, B, or C (see page 07 for full course list) or a 5-credit Advanced CTS course

Applied Degree

Length

4 years at RDC

Built on a foundation of communication, storytelling, directing and business skills, this new four-year program offers you the choice of three majors: Acting, Film Production or Live Entertainment Production.

Graduates will be well-prepared to work in the exciting film, theatre and live entertainment industry, or to create their own business opportunities. There are no formal classes in the fourth year, instead students will be guided and supported by faculty to find experiences within industry or in the creation of independent projects.

Admission Requirements

- Minimum 60% in ELA 30-1
- _ Minimum 50% in one course from group A, B or C (see page 07 for full course list)
- 30-level Fine Arts course is recommended

Transfer Degree

Length

2 years at RDC; transfer to a University after 2 years

Guided by a group of experienced faculty, all of whom are practicing artists, you will learn a wide range of studiobased technical skills and theoretical approaches. You will practice and study foundational artistic principals, drawing, painting, sculpture, ceramics, art history and professional practices, as well as complete required university level English courses and breadth electives. Throughout your time at RDC you will have the opportunity to take transferable coursework and develop a robust portfolio to successfully transfer to a university and complete your degree.

Admission Requirements

- Minimum average of 60%
- Minimum 50% in ELA 30-1 or ELA 30-2
- Minimum 50% in one course from group A, B or C (see page 07 for full course list)

Note: Students who enter the program with English 30-2 must take English 30-1 or the equivalent (English 095) and may not complete the program in four terms.

Transfer Opportunities

You may transfer up to 20 course equivalents taken at Red Deer College to the University of Alberta, University of Calgary, University of Lethbridge, Alberta University of the Arts, NSCAD University, and Emily Carr University of Art + Design. 12 months at RDC

Build your confidence as a facilitator of adult learning. In this certificate, you will gain the theoretical understanding and skills to design engaging learning experiences, develop varied assessments and embark on research related areas of individual interest.

Admission Requirements

- An undergraduate degree in any discipline from an accredited institution

OR

 A two year diploma or equivalent training from an accredited institution in any discipline

OR

 Provincial Trades Certificate or Red Seal Journeyperson's Certificate

OR

- A one year certificate in any discipline from an accredited institution upon consultation and the approval of the Associate Dean

Water Well Drillers set up and operate mobile rotary, boring or cable tool drilling rigs used to drill residential, commercial and industrial water wells. In addition, they conduct environmental assessment drilling. Water Well Driller shares a common first year with Earth Loop Technicians.

Earth Loop Technicians set up and operate mobile drilling rigs or trenching equipment used to construct loops for heating and cooling. Earth loop technicians may also be responsible for the service and installation of geothermal heat pumps. Earth Loop Technician shares a common first year with Water Well Driller.

SWAC is a flexible and responsive program intended to support students in obtaining a high school diploma in an environment that addresses their learning styles, personalizes programming to meet their high school educational needs and exposes students to post-secondary opportunities. The program brings together four school districts (Red Deer Public, Red Deer Catholic, Chinook's Edge, and Wolf Creek) and Red Deer College.

- Students earn post-secondary credits in addition to high school credits while still in grade 12
- Tuition and the cost of the Automotive Service Technician or Welding student resources will be covered by SWAC project funds
