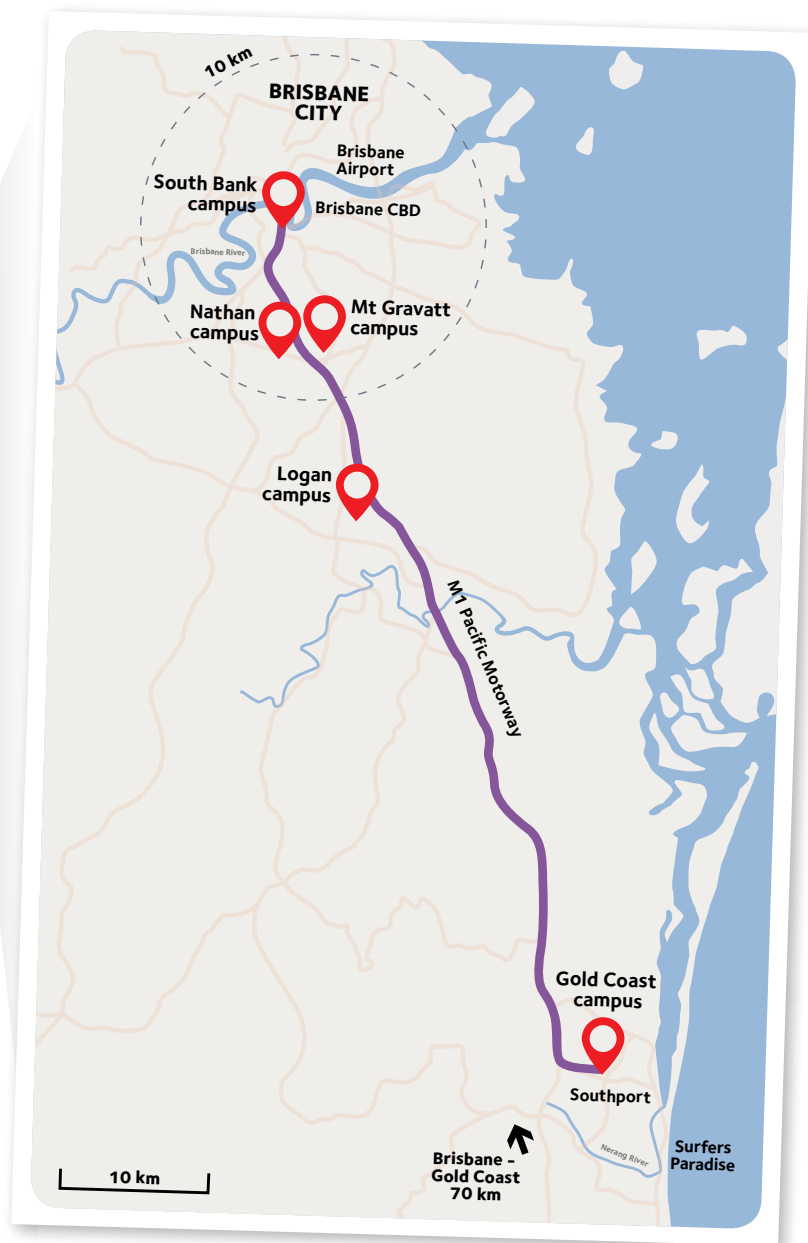

BRISBANE

Home to 2.19 million people, Brisbane is the capital city of Queensland and is Australia's third largest city. Transport

All of our campuses are well serviced by public transport. Our Logan and Nathan campuses have regular bus services and our Mt Gravatt campus is conveniently located on the South East Busway. Located in the heart of Brisbane, our South Bank campus is serviced by extensive bus, train and ferry services. Our Gold Coast campus has regular bus connections and two stops

on the new Gold Coast light-rail rapid transit system. Visit translink.com.au for more information.

Griffith has two intercampus bus services. A free bus runs regularly between the Mt Gravatt and Nathan campuses and the Student Guild operates an intercampus bus between the Gold Coast and Nathan campuses during the semester.

GOLD COAST

Griffith's Gold Coast campus is one hour's drive south of Brisbane and just a 10 minute drive from the region's world-famous beaches.

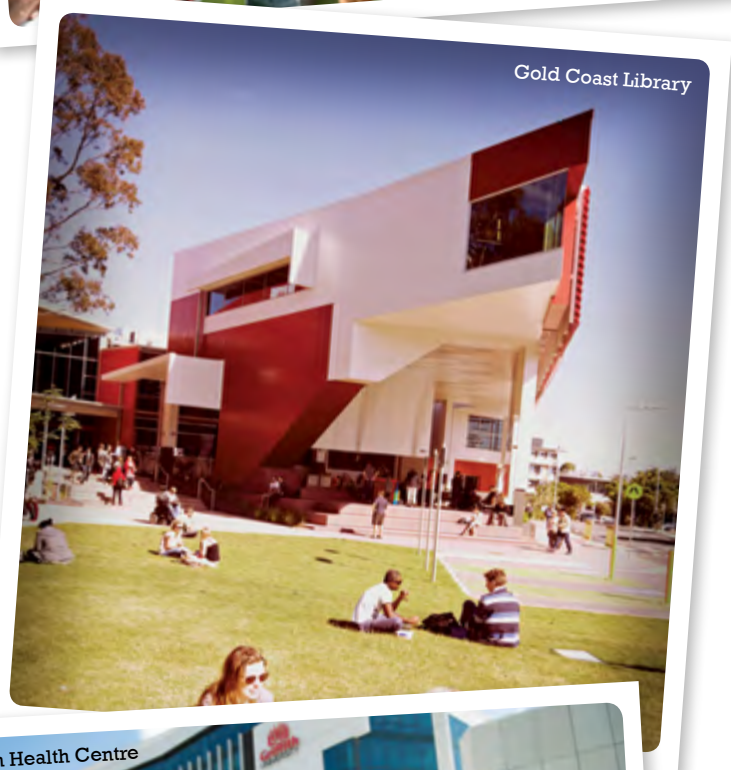
The campus is in the final stages of a major building program which has already seen the completion of tennis, basketball and beach volleyball courts, an extension to the campus library, and the new Griffith Health Centre. Recently completed, the new Business Building includes a fully-operational mock trading room and opened in mid-2014.

The Griffith Health Centre and co-located Gold Coast University Hospital form the core of the Gold Coast Health and Knowledge Precinct. This world-class health, medical research and teaching facility brings all of Griffith's health programs – including medicine, psychology, dentistry and nutrition – under one roof, offering students enhanced opportunities for multidisciplinary education.

Study areas available at the Gold Coast include: business and government; criminology and law; education; engineering and IT; environment, planning and architecture; health; humanities and languages; music; science; and visual and creative arts.

Facilities on-campus include a campus bookshop, cafes and food outlets, computer shop, general store, hairdresser, medical centre, post office, travel agent, gym and fitness centre, Olympic-standard athletics track, and tennis, basketball, netball and beach volleyball courts.

Privately owned and operated on-campus accommodation is available at the Griffith University Village, offering one-bedroom studios to five-bedroom apartments. The campus has regular bus services and two stops on the new light rail network which connects the campus with the city's retail and restaurant hubs, and beaches.



NATHAN

Nathan, our first campus, officially opened in 1975 with 451 students and four study areas. Today, it hosts over 16,000 students and offers degrees in business and government, engineering and information technology, environment, humanities and languages, law, science and aviation.

Our Nathan campus is located a short 10-minute drive from Brisbane's CBD in tranquil, native bushland on the edge of the Toohey Forest. Study areas available at Nathan include: business and government; criminology and law; engineering and information technology; environment, planning and architecture; nursing; humanities and languages; and science and aviation.

Facilities on-campus include a fitness centre, squash and tennis courts, sports fields, bookshop, cafes and food outlets, hairdresser, pharmacy, post office, travel agent, computer shop, general store, and medical centre. There are four residential colleges on the Nathan campus, offering both catered and self-catered accommodation options. There is also an additional postgraduate college that offers self-catered accommodation.

The campus is regularly serviced by public transport, including the free inter-campus bus which runs between the Mt Gravatt and Nathan campuses.



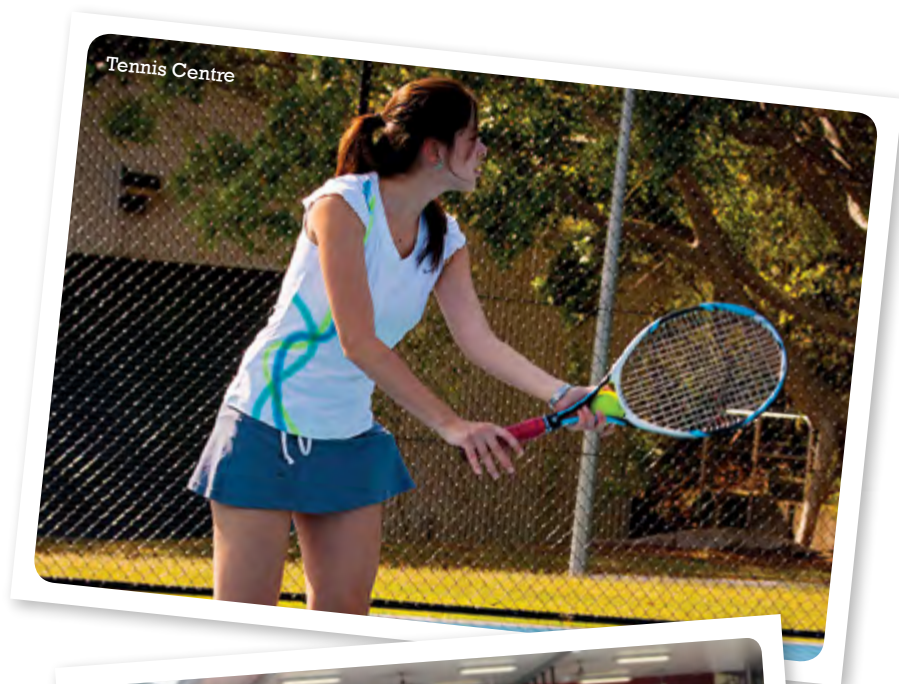
MT GRAVATT

Adjacent to Nathan campus with panoramic views of Brisbane, our Mt Gravatt campus is our social sciences and humanities hub. The campus hosts 5,000 students and is the base for research into critical social issues, including education and suicide prevention.

Located across the motorway from our Nathan campus, Griffith's Mt Gravatt campus has panoramic views of Brisbane city and offers programs focusing on social issues including criminology and criminal justice, education, and psychology.

The campus boasts an extensive range of sporting facilities, including the Griffith Aquatic and Fitness Centre – complete with three heated swimming pools and a state-of-the-art fitness centre – and the Griffith University Tennis Centre, which includes 12 plexi-cushion courts, four synthetic grass courts, clubroom, pro shop and licensed cafe. Additional on-campus facilities include basketball and netball courts, campus bookshop, cafes and food outlets, and a general store.

The Mt Gravatt Residential College offers catered on-campus accommodation for students, with three meals per day provided in the college dining rooms. The campus is conveniently located on the South East Busway and is also connected to our Nathan campus by the free inter-campus bus service.



LOGAN

This community campus is renowned as a national showcase of social inclusion in higher education through innovative partnerships, industry engagement and degree pathways, with a strong focus on community health, education and business.

Our Logan campus is ideally located between Brisbane and the Gold Coast in one of Australia's most rapidly developing regions. The campus has a strong focus on community health and education with study areas including business, criminology, education, child and family studies, human services, nursing and social work.

Facilities on-campus include a campus bookshop, cafe and food outlets, fitness centre, general store, hairdresser, tennis courts and sporting fields. The campus is regularly serviced by public transport and is just a ten-minute bus ride from the nearest train station.

Privately owned and operated student accommodation located a five-minute walk from campus is available at UniCentral Griffith and offers students additional facilities including a 25-metre swimming pool and a BBQ and picnic area.



SOUTH BANK

Located in Brisbane's cultural heart, the South Bank campus is renowned for excellence in the creative and performing arts. The campus houses the Queensland College of Art, the Queensland Conservatorium, the Griffith Film School and the Griffith Graduate Centre, with a total of 3,600 students.

Griffith's South Bank campus is a 10 minute walk from the Brisbane CBD across the Brisbane River and is ideally located in the city's arts and cultural precinct adjacent to the Queensland Art Gallery, Gallery of Modern Art, the State Library, Museum, Performing Arts Complex and the Brisbane Exhibition and Convention Centre.

Home to the Queensland College of Art, Queensland Conservatorium, Griffith Film School and the Griffith Graduate Centre the campus focuses on the study areas of business, public health, health services management, music, and visual and creative arts.

Facilities on-campus include an art store, bookshop, cafe, and public theatres and galleries. The campus is regularly serviced by public transport including extensive train, bus and ferry networks. Privately owned and operated purpose-built student accommodation is available at Urbanest, located a 5-minute walk from campus.



RESEARCH AND RANKINGS

Griffith University is one of Australia's leading research universities, with research excellence in areas of international importance. Griffith is ranked in the top 5% of universities worldwide in three world rankings, the Academic Ranking of World Universities (ARWU), QS World University Rankings and the Leiden Ranking.

Research Excellence

As a founding member of Australia's Innovative Research Universities network, Griffith is continually investing in its research facilities. The new Sir Samuel Griffith Centre is Australia's first zero-emission, self-powered teaching and research facility. The concept for the Centre came from research by Professor Evan Gray, leader of the National Hydrogen Materials Reference Facility (NHMRF), the headquarters of which are at Griffith.

The new Griffith Health Centre and State Government funded Gold Coast University Hospital are at the centre of a unique Health and Knowledge precinct. These facilities, as well as the Griffith Health Institute, are a focal point for medical research and provide an ideal environment for staff and students to conduct ground-breaking clinical trials.

As a research intensive university, Griffith has a comprehensive portfolio of research centres across our five campuses. Researchers at Griffith have a supportive research community, vibrant research culture, and state-of-the-art facilities.

Diverse Research

ARTS, EDUCATION AND LAW

We are one of Australia's leading social sciences institutions, ranking in the world's top 200 in the Academic Ranking of World Universities in Social Sciences.

The creative work from the Queensland College of Art and the Queensland Conservatorium continues to have local, national and international impact.

Diversity is a key feature, encompassing eight research centres and eight schools and colleges.

BUSINESS

Griffith Business School focuses on the Asia-Pacific region and is Australia's home to the longest-established centre for teaching and research in this area - the Griffith Asia Institute, which has strong affiliations with national and international leading think tanks, government and industry.

We're a world leader in government and international relations research, being rated 5 out of 5 for political science research in the 2012 Excellence in Research for Australia report.

HEALTH

The Griffith Health Institute is home to 750 researchers undertaking molecular, behavioural and population health research. Its co-location with the \$1.76 billion Gold Coast University Hospital and the Griffith Health Centre provides a unique health and educational precinct.

Griffith is host to the first National Health and Medical Research Council Centre of Research Excellence in Nursing, as well as host of the Australian Institute for Suicide Research and Prevention - a World Health Organisation Collaborating Centre for Research and Training in Suicide Prevention.

SCIENCES

Our internationally recognised supervisors have access to some of Australia's most technically advanced research facilities. With a rich blend of innovation and traditional disciplines, you'll be supervised by academic professionals who are active researchers in their field.

Our research facilities include medical and life sciences research centres - Eskitis Institute and the Institute for Glycomics - as well as the Centre for Quantum Dynamics and the Queensland Micro- and Nanotechnology Centre. Griffith also hosts the National Climate Change Adaptation Research Facility, funded by the Australian Government.

Research Highlights

ESKITIS INSTITUTE

The Eskitis Institute for Drug Discovery focuses on the search for, and development of, drugs and cell-based therapies.

The Institute is focussed on three disease areas:

- **Cancer** – Investigating the biological mechanisms associated with cancer and establishing pathways that can be manipulated to prevent this illness
- **Neurological diseases** – Exploring the causes of neurological diseases including Parkinson's disease and related disorders
- **Infectious Diseases** – Focusing on diseases including malaria, sleeping sickness and tuberculosis, researchers search for new compounds with drug potential.

The Eskitis Institute uses a unique source of information called Nature Bank to carry out much of its research. Nature Bank is a collection of over 45,000 samples of plants and marine invertebrates. The Bank is shared with researchers around the world, who test the library to find new compounds that could be developed into new drugs.

Nature Bank is already being used to search for new drugs for malaria, sleeping sickness, cancer, Parkinson's disease, schizophrenia, stroke, thrombosis, tuberculosis, HIV and Alzheimer's disease.

GLOBAL CENTRE FOR EVIDENCE-BASED CORRECTIONS AND SENTENCING

The school of Criminology and Criminal Justice works closely with a range of government and community partners to improve knowledge and practice with

national and international leaders across many fields including:

- crime prevention
- policing and security
- restorative justice
- corrections
- forensic mental health

We are part of a newly established Global Centre for Evidence-based Corrections and Sentencing, an international knowledge exchange and collaborative research network which engages researchers, policy makers, and practitioners interested in corrections and sentencing. The centre works collaboratively with international partners and policymakers on the development of evidence-based corrections programs and sentencing policies and practices that maximize public safety.

GRIFFITH INSTITUTE FOR TOURISM

The Griffith Institute for Tourism has a wide range of expertise on areas such as tourism planning, economic modelling, service management, event management, marketing, environmental impact assessment, and cultural studies.

The Institute's strategic research programs include:

- **Climate change and resilience** – This program focuses on addressing climate change by enhancing the resilience of tourism systems. Tourist destinations and businesses can proactively prepare for climate change by decarbonising their operations and by understanding the current and future impacts of extreme weather events and changing climatic conditions.
- **Tourism business in Asia Pacific** – Taking the concepts of livelihood and business resilience as vantage points,

this strategic research program aims at contributing to two separate but interrelated bodies of knowledge about tourism businesses in situations of rapid change and crisis, and the role of tourism businesses in livelihood strategies.

- **Customer experience in tourism** – This program focuses on developing a better understanding of how tourists experience and make sense of a range of interactive touch points in planning, consuming and evaluating tourism systems.

CENTRE FOR QUANTUM DYNAMICS

The Centre for Quantum Dynamics is aimed at understanding quantum dynamics, to develop new ways of controlling it and applying it to future technologies.

In 2012, researchers at the Centre took the first photo of the shadow of an atom using a super high-resolution microscope not available anywhere else in the world. In 2013 they captured new images of light bending around a single atom. These images could revolutionise humankind's understanding of physics and how the world works.

Research Hub

The Griffith Research Hub provides a rich and informative guide to our research expertise. Hannah Zulch, Germany, PhD in Psychology and Environmental Sciences, Nathan and Mt Gravatt

Through sponsorship from the Griffith Climate Change Research Program, German PhD student **Hannah R. Zulch** has presented her research on psychological preparedness for natural disasters at 12 national and international conferences.

Currently based at Griffith's Mt Gravatt and Nathan campuses, Hannah has thrived under her "expert supervisors" who along with the international student Advisors, she says, have provided her with "invaluable guidance and support" throughout her PhD studies.

Hannah will use her research, and recent personal experience of the 2011 and 2013 floods, to help people psychologically prepare for future natural disasters.

"Once I finish my PhD thesis, I hope to work with the Australian Government to optimise disaster preparedness in disaster prone regions," she said.

- The Nathan Fitness Centre has pin-loaded free weights plus electronic cardio exercise machines and also offers group fitness classes
- The Nathan campus has squash courts and two sports fields
- Sports facilities at Logan include multi-purpose sports courts, sporting fields, a gymnasium and a nearby golf course.

Larissa is exploring the parainfluenza virus which can cause severe respiratory tract infections in children and results in many hospitalisations around the world each year. She wants to understand what makes this virus so aggressive, how it infects cells and, potentially, how to block the virus. There are currently no effective drugs or vaccines against the parainfluenza virus.

Larissa has a pharmaceutical science background, which is why she is so interested in drug discovery and development. She had considered becoming a doctor but enjoyed her work in the lab so much she got the research "bug". Larissa chose Griffith because the Institute for Glycomics is one of only six such glycoscience facilities in the world, and the only one of its type in Australia.

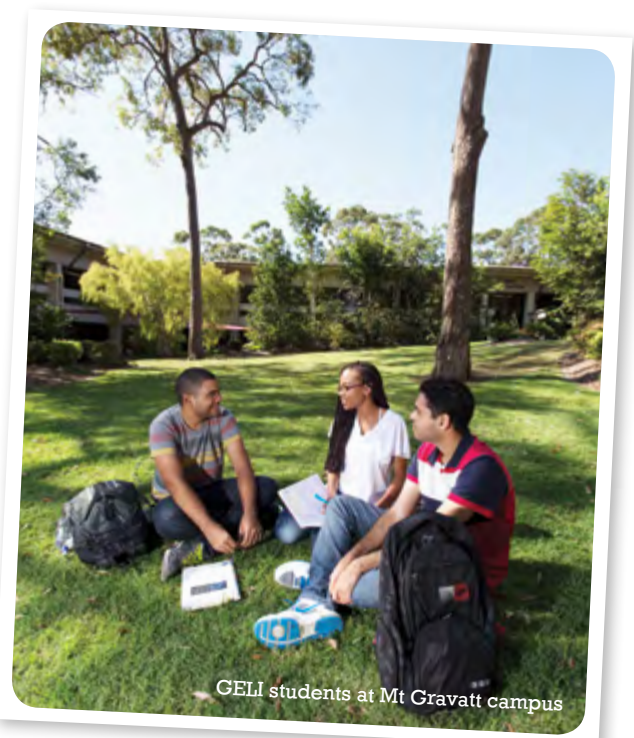

HOW DO I APPLY?

The Griffith Mates are waiting to welcome you, our new facilities are ready, and your lecturers are eager to meet you – what are you waiting for? It's time to start your Griffith journey! With applications open all year round, you can quickly complete your Griffith application in **five easy steps**.

1 Check academic entry requirements

Entry to our undergraduate programs mainly requires completion of secondary school, but some programs have higher entry requirements. Entry to our postgraduate programs mainly requires completion of a bachelor degree, but some programs have more specific entry requirements.

Some programs have specific prerequisites or require the submission of portfolios, medical checks or professional work experience. Search for your program online at griffith.edu.au/degree-career-finder to view any additional entry requirements.

2 Check English entry requirements

Entry to our degree programs usually requires an overall IELTS (Academic) band score of 6.5 with no band score less than 6.0. Search for your program online at griffith.edu.au/degree-career-finder to view equivalent English language proficiency test scores.

3 Apply for credit/ advanced standing

If you have existing formal qualifications, you can apply for credit or advanced standing when you lodge your Griffith application. To see what credit you are eligible for, search for your institution on our credit precedent database griffith.edu.au/credit

If your program isn't listed and you'd like to apply for credit, you'll need to supply official documentation for your program, including:

- program structure
- entry and graduation requirements
- assessment methods and detailed subject outlines.

4 Submit your application

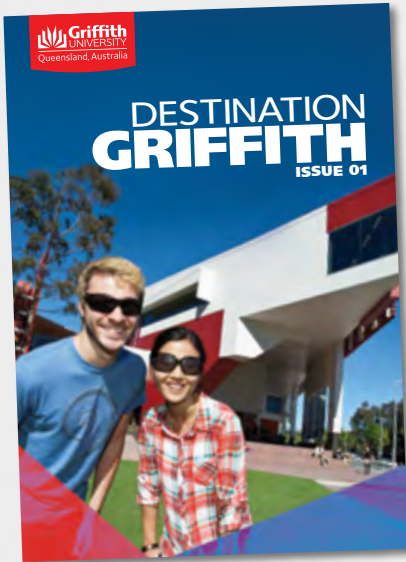

WHAT WILL MY STUDY COST?

The cost of living in Australia varies according to your lifestyle and requirements. You will need to have funding for not only your tuition fees, Overseas Student Health Cover and visa, but also essential living costs such as accommodation, food, clothing, entertainment, transport and phone.

More funds are needed for things such as textbooks, medical expenses and recreational activities. Part-time work can assist with financial needs but should not be relied upon to cover full living expenses.

TUITION COSTS

You will find the tuition costs outlined in this guide under each program. Check griffith.edu.au/degree-career-finder for up-to-date fee information.

EQUIPMENT/TEXTBOOKS

For most courses you will need to purchase textbooks and other study material and equipment. You will be able to purchase some of these materials from the campus bookshop, while others can be found online, bought second hand or borrowed from the university library. Griffith also offers a textbook exchange service which allows students to buy and sell textbooks.

OVERSEAS STUDENT HEALTH COVER

It is a condition of your student visa that you have Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC) for the entire duration of your stay in Australia. Your Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC) premium amount and duration will be outlined in your offer letter.

LIVING AND ACCOMMODATION COSTS

The cost of housing varies according to the type of accommodation and location you want. We suggest you visit griffith.edu.au/international/life-in-australia/accommodation to learn more about accommodation options on and off campus.

It is also important to consider the cost of electricity, gas and water. Some accommodation options include these expenses in the monthly rent, but sometimes you will be expected to pay for these separately.

As a guide you will need **AU\$18,610 - \$30,000** per year, to meet your living expenses.

- Temporary accommodation
- Bond and rent for permanent accommodation
- Connection to telephone, internet, electricity and gas
- Basic furniture and homewares
- Food
- Transport

- Entertainment
