LIFE IN WESTERN AUSTRALIA

Accommodation

There are a variety of accommodation options available to international students studying in Western Australia.

Temporary

This may be a good option for when you first arrive in Western Australia. You can search for temporary accommodation through the internet and book online. There are many hostels or guest houses that range from \$90 to \$150* per week.

Shared rental

Many students choose to share a rental house or apartment with other students as this reduces costs. The rental price for a furnished room in shared accommodation is between \$85 to \$215* per week. This cost does not usually include electricity, water or gas.

Living on campus

The campus living options include:

- > Edith Cowan University (ECU) Village, Mt Lawley rooms start from \$199 per week;
- Murdoch University Village, Murdoch rooms start from \$168 per week;
- > Pepperell Village, Geraldton rooms start from \$125 per week;
- > ECU Village, Bunbury rooms start from \$185 per week.

Homestay

This is very popular because you can make Australian friends, embrace the Australian lifestyle and improve your English.

Homestay costs between \$275- \$310 per week, depending on your age and level of service provided. There is also a Homestay placement fee of \$250.*

Work

You may decide to find a part time job to increase your income and gain work experience while studying.

Your student visa allows you to work while you are in Australia for up to 40 hours per fortnight during each semester and unlimited hours during semester breaks.

Transport

Arrival

Once you arrive in Western Australia you have a number of different options to connect you to your campus location. You can travel by car, train or bus to the majority of campus locations. From Perth Airport you can fly by plane to the more remote regional campus locations.

Airport pickup can be arranged at a cost of \$130, students will be taken directly to their homestay family or temporary accommodation. Airport pick up is compulsory for students under 18. Please contact AHN at **homestaynetwork.org** ^[2] to organise this service.

A taxi from the airport to central Perth costs approximately \$50. An airport bus (\$20) is also available and can drop passengers at central city hotels.

Free travel in central Perth

One of the best features of life in Perth is the free travel around the central business district. This allows you to travel for free on buses or trains within the Free Transit Zone.

Perth, Fremantle and Joondalup also have free Central Area Transit (CAT) buses that allow you to travel for free within these central business districts.

Discount travel for students

International students studying full time at TAFE colleges are entitled to discounted travel on Transperth and regional town bus services. To access you will need to apply for a Tertiary SmartRider. Find out more here transperth.wa.gov.au/ smartrider/types-of-smartrider/tertiary-smartrider [2]

International driver's licence

If you have a current licence from your home country you may be able to drive in Western Australia. HELP AND ADVICE

Overseas health cover

All international students studying in Australia are required to pay Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC) for the entire duration of their student visa. OSHC is offered by a number of different providers.

TIWA has a preferred provider arrangement with Bupa. If you wish to use another provider, you will need to make your own payment arrangements and show evidence of the payment to the Department of Immigration and Border Protection when you apply for your visa.

Support services

TAFE college support

The International Centre at your TAFE college can provide support relating to your study or personal issues. College staff will be able to assist you with:

- > advice on courses and pathways;
- > identifying suitable accommodation in one of the local suburbs;
- > your application for continuing enrolment;
- > advice on change of course/ units pathways;
- updating your contact details (i.e. address, email, mobile numbers);
- monitoring your class progress and assisting you to achieve your study goals;
- > Overseas Student Health Care information; and
- > public transport information.

Safety

International students in Perth enjoy a safe and secure study environment. However you should always take care particularly when out and about at night. The International Centre staff at your college can help you by providing support and advice to you during your studies.

Orientation

When you arrive in Western Australia you must attend an orientation session at your college. You will be sent your orientation details once your Confirmation of Enrolment (CoE) has been issued.

At orientation you will:

- > receive your class timetable;
- > be given a tour of your campus;
- > find out important information relating to your studies; and
- > find out more information if you have not received an OSHC card.

Create your Unique Student Identifier (USI)

Please note all students enrolled at a TAFE college in Australia need to have a Unique Student Identifier (USI). The USI is linked to your enrolment record and provides you with easy access to your training records and results whenever you need them.

You need to create your USI prior to attending your orientation session. To create your USI go to **usi.gov.au**

Bringing dependant children

In Australia it is compulsory for school-aged dependants to undertake full-time studies. If you are bringing school aged children with you to Australia, you will require a Confirmation of Placement (CoP) to secure your child's dependant visa. The CoP provides evidence of schooling arrangements. For more information about receiving a CoP please see page 119.

You will be required to fund the tuition of your dependant children. Note that annual tuition fees for public school enrolments must be paid to TIWA, prior to a placement at a school being confirmed.

STUDYING AT TAFE

All courses offered by TAFE colleges to international students are registered on the Australian Government Commonwealth Register of Institutions and Courses for Overseas Students (CRICOS) and are full time.

Full time study for international students at TAFE consists of around 20 hours of training per week.

TAFE colleges in Western Australia deliver a range of courses that are developed in consultation with industry and are reviewed regularly to ensure that students graduate with the skills and knowledge required for a successful employment outcome.

Where there is a note in the course information which indicates that a course is under review, this may mean a change in course number, change in course content and/or the introduction of new learning and delivery styles. The new course will continue to be industry focused and get students started on their career pathway.

Australian Qualification Framework (AQF) levels

You can choose to study different types of courses at Western Australian TAFE colleges. Each course type represents a different AQF level.

Please see below the course types and qualification levels:

- > Level 2 Certificate II
- > Level 3 Certificate III
- > Level 4 Certificate IV
- > Level 5 Diploma
- > Level 6 Advanced Diploma, Associate Degree

Each TAFE program may include multiple qualification levels that each take a different length of time to complete.

Industry training

TAFE colleges in Western Australia deliver a range of courses that are developed in consultation with industry and are reviewed regularly to ensure that students graduate with the skills and knowledge required for a successful employment outcome.

TAFE courses involve more "hands on" activities and practical experience than university.

These activities may include workshops and projects as well as work experience placement.

Competency Based Training (CBT)

Training packages & CBT

Training packages are used as the basis for most of the Vocational Education and Training (VET) programs delivered by TAFE colleges throughout Australia.

A training package is a set of nationally endorsed standards and qualifications for recognising and assessing people's skills in a specific industry, industry sector or enterprise.

They are developed by national Industry Skills Councils (ISCs) in consultation with industry and are not owned by an individual training provider.

Training package qualifications are made up of a set of core and elective units of competency. These units of competency outline the skills and knowledge students must acquire if they are to successfully complete a qualification. These competencies are delivered by qualified trainers using a Competency Based Training (CBT) approach.

CBT places emphasis on what a person can do in the workplace as a result of completing a program of training.

Competency Based Assessment

Competency Based Assessment is the process of collecting evidence and making judgements as to whether a competency has been achieved. The purpose of assessment is to confirm that a student can perform to the standard expected in the workplace as outlined in the competency. The evidence may be collected by observing a student undertaking a task in the workplace, through a formal theory test, the completion of a project and so on.

If students believe that they are already competent, they can apply for Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL). RPL is the term used to describe a number of assessment processes that formally recognise the competencies an individual has acquired through formal or non-formal learning, work experience and/or life experience.

TAFE PATHWAYS TO UNIVERSITY

There are many pathways from TAFE to university. TAFE courses will provide you with a strong grounding in your chosen field and prepare you to be ready for your university studies.

A Diploma, Advanced Diploma, Higher Education Diploma or Associate Degree can provide you with a pathway into Bachelor Degree programs with leading Western Australian universities.

Start your studies at TAFE

The advantages of starting your studies at TAFE include:

- > industry focused pathway to further study
- > smaller class sizes with extra English and academic support;
- > practical, employment focused skills that will complement your degree; and
- > may reduce your study load, course duration and fees when you enrol into your university degree.

University credits

To gain the equivalent of one year of advanced standing, you need the following credit points:

- > Curtin University = 200 credit points;
- > Edith Cowan University (ECU) = 120 credit points;
- > Murdoch University = 24 credit points; and
- > The University of Western Australia (UWA) = 48 credit points.

Please note the structure of credit points may not apply to all courses.

On completion of TAFE and university you will have two qualifications which are attractive to employers and will give you a competitive edge in the global job market.

University packages

If you are considering studying an undergraduate degree after your TAFE program, you have the option of packaging that course with Curtin University, Edith Cowan University (ECU), Murdoch University or The University of Western Australia (UWA).

You can commence a Diploma, Advanced Diploma or Associate Degree pathway with TAFE and, on completion, transfer to your chosen university to complete your degree program. When you apply for a packaged program you will receive a student visa for the whole period of your study.

Please note: To submit an application for a university package you must use a Registered Agent of the relevant university and TIWA. Your agent will assist you with the packaged application and guide you through the visa process. A list of Education Agents in your country can be viewed at tafeinternational.wa.edu.au/agents [2]

If you have completed the equivalent of Australian Year 12, you may start at Certificate IV or Diploma level. English language requirements

The basic level of English proficiency required for entry into most TAFE courses is the equivalent of Academic IELTS 5.5 with no band lower than 5.0.

Some courses and some passport nationalities may require a higher level of English i.e. IELTS 6.0 or 6.5. You can find this information in the course section of this guide.

Please note the IELTS test is only valid for 2 years.

English pathways to TAFE

Students who need to improve their English can package an English course with their TAFE program.

The North Metropolitan TAFE and South Metropolitan TAFE English Language Centres offer English Language Intensive Courses for Overseas Students (ELICOS). There are a range of ELICOS courses available to improve your English language skills.

An ELICOS course will help you to meet the admission requirements of a TAFE course or develop your English skills to further your career.

South Metropolitan TAFE, South Regional TAFE and North Regional TAFE also offer the Certificates in Written and Spoken English.

Folio requirements

There are several courses within the Art, Design and Multimedia study area at **North Metropolitan TAFE** that require you to submit a folio of your for admission to your course.

Fees

The 2017 tuition fees for TAFE courses begin at approximately \$5 880 AUD per semester. Resource fees and material fees may also be payable, please see the section below for more information.

English Language Intensive Courses for Overseas Students (ELICOS) fees are \$300 AUD per week.

Tuition fees are reviewed annually. If tuition fees are increased you will be required to pay the new fees as they are introduced.

Resource & material fees

Many of the courses offered through TAFE International Western Australia have a <u>resource fee</u> which includes any consumable that is used by a student in the course of their study e.g. paint, internet use; and/ or a <u>materials fee</u> which includes any item that remains the property of the student after the course e.g. personal protective equipment, tools, text books.

These fees must be paid to your college once you have attended your orientation session.

Application process



1. Find a course

2. Check the entry requirements

All applicants can study at TAFE in the calendar year they are turning 18. There are no English or Academic entry requirements to begin our English (ELICOS) programs. However, all of our Certificate and Diploma courses have specific Academic and English proficiency requirements. You can find out about these requirements by going to the TAFE International Western Australia (TIWA) website tafeinternational.wa.edu.au

Make sure that you can meet the entry requirements of your chosen course before you proceed to the next step in the application process.

Application and Acceptance Deadlines

Deadlines for submitting applications to TIWA for admission to TAFE courses depend on your passport nationality and whether or not you are applying onshore or offshore.

You should also be aware that there are deadlines for accepting offers and making fee payment. CoEs will not be issued after the cut-off date, this is to ensure that you leave a reasonable time to get your visa and arrive in time for orientation and the start of classes.

Receive your Letter of Offer

Once we have received your application and supporting documentation, we will assess your eligibility to study your selected course(s). If eligible and there are places available we will send you a 'Letter of Offer'. This letter will be sent to you directly or through the education agent you have nominated according to your instructions on the application form.

If we have not received all of the required supporting documentation from you, for example certified copies of certificates etc. then your Letter of Offer will have conditions listed noting the information you still need to provide.

There are many high demand courses that fill up very quickly, so you should consider returning your acceptance and payment promptly.

Please note your place is subject to availability at the time of acceptance and payment.

You will also need to allow sufficient time before your course starts to obtain your visa and make arrangements to come to Western Australia. Usually at least 3 - 6 months is needed to do this.

4. Accept your offer and pay

To accept your offer, you must return your signed Letter of Acceptance with:

- > Supporting documentation that you were requested to supply, in your Letter of Offer (i.e. conditions).
- > Payment of your schedule of fees, as indicated on your Letter of Offer.

5. Receive your Confirmation of Enrolment (CoE) and apply for your student visa

Subject to the availability of places after you have signed and returned the Letter of Acceptance, made full payment and met any conditions, we will provide you with a Confirmation of Enrolment (CoE) which you will need in order to apply for a student visa at the Australian High Commission or Embassy in your country.

You must have a student visa in order to enter Australia and start your studies.
