

Booking your accommodation

Now you have received your offer, you can apply for your accommodation. We understand that moving home is a big part of starting university life so we have provided some useful information below.

Leeds Beckett accommodation

We have 12 Halls of Residence where you will have your own space and share the kitchen and dining area. It depends on which Halls you choose as we have a variety of options.

Private accommodation

You can also rent private accommodation through an organisation called Unipol - a housing agency supported by our University. Unipol can help you find good quality accommodation in Leeds. They offer free impartial advice and only recommend landlords that have a good reputation.

If you are booking private accommodation it is important you don't sign a contract until you have seen the property in person. It is a good idea to come to Leeds early and take some time to view different properties to see what is available in your price range.

Your safety

All our Halls of Residence have 24 hour security, emergency call phones, CCTV and secure entry systems. The majority of our Halls have an onsite office where you can contact your residential officer and talk to them about any queries you may have.

Not booked before you arrive?

If you don't have any accommodation booked before you arrive, we advise you to book a bed and breakfast until you are able to secure your accommodation. Contact the accommodation office when you arrive to check availability of rooms. We can supply a list of reputable bed and breakfasts in the area

There is a high demand for our accommodation and places can go quickly so please apply as early as possible.

Paying your course fees

When you have accepted your unconditional offer from us, you will be ready to pay your fees or show evidence of sponsorship. We hope the information below is useful and provides a good guide on when and how you will pay your course tuition fees.

Course fee charges

Your course fees will vary depending on your course and your fee status, which will be either overseas or home/EU. Your course fee will be in your offer letter and fees for each course are also listed in our online prospectus.

EU students

If you are an undergraduate student from the EU or come from Norway, Iceland or Switzerland you will be able to apply for a UK student loan. You should have received information about this in your offer letter. If you have not applied for a UK student loan, please visit the Student Loans website for EU and EEA students.

Payment for CAS

You will need a CAS (Confirmation of Acceptance for Studies) in order to apply for your Tier 4 Student Visa. In order to receive your CAS number you will be required to pay 50% of your first year course fees once you have accepted your unconditional offer with us. If you have sponsorship you will need to provide a copy of your sponsorship letter.

Early payment discount

If you're an overseas fee status student, we offer a 10% early payment discount if you pay your course fees in full by 15 January 2017. This discount is only offered for your first year of study.

Living costs and personal finances

When preparing to study at Leeds Beckett you should also budget for costs including accommodation, food, transport and social activities. Living costs are dependent on your lifestyle, but the estimated cost for one year is around £9,135 including accommodation. Your course fee will be additional to your living costs.

How to pay

It is important to include your name and university student ID number when you pay. Please note that bank charges may apply for international transfers. Full details of how to pay can be found at

Applying for your Visa

If you are from outside the EU and European Economic Area (EEA), you will require a visa to study in the UK. This is called a Tier 4 General Student Visa. Once you have accepted your unconditional offer and paid at least 50% of your course fees, you can apply to us for a CAS number. You will need your CAS number in order to apply for your UK visa.

If you are an EU citizen, a Swiss national or from the EEA, you do not need a visa to study in the UK.

When to apply for your Visa

Once you have your CAS number you can apply for your UK Visa. You will need to submit your Visa application within 90 days (three months) of your course start date. The applications requirements are very strict so you must ensure you provide all the correct documents and demonstrate a sufficient level of funds to support your Visa application.

How to apply for your Visa

Follow the instructions on the <u>UKVI website</u>. You may be asked to apply for your Visa online and book an appointment at the UK Visas and Immigration Centre in your country.

Studying for less than six months

If you require a Visa to study in the UK but your course is less than six months, you can apply for

a short-term study Visa. You will need to be aware that this visa does not allow you to work in the UK and cannot be extended beyond six months. To apply visit: gov.uk/study-visit-visa/apply

Pre-sessional English language course

You may be doing a 10 week pre-sessional course to improve your English skills. If you plan to stay in the UK after this course to continue your studies you will need to apply for a Tier 4 General Student Visa, prior to travelling to the UK.

Biometric Residence Permit

For a Tier 4 General Student Visa you will require a Biometric Residence Permit (BRP). This is only needed if you are planning on studying in the UK for longer than six months. You will apply for your Biometric Residence Permit through the UK Visas and Immigration Centre in your country and collect it when you arrive in the UK. Collecting your Biometric Residence Permit

You will collect your Biometric Residence Permit in the UK at a designated Post Office. You will need to enter your correct UK address on your Visa application in order to collect your BRP from the relevant Post Office.

Your BRP must be collected from a Post Office within 10 days of arriving in the UK.

When you enter your UK address on your visa application you will be provided with one or more Post Office locations, of which you need to choose one.

Take some time to consider which Post Office is convenient for your UK accommodation or the campus you are studying at. If your course is based at Headingley Campus your nearest Post Office is the Headingley Post Office, Arndale Centre, Otley Road. If your course is based at City Campus, The Markets Post Office, New York Street is the nearest.

Please also note that if your Visa requires that you register with the police, you must collect your BRP and take this with you to the police station. This must be done within seven days of your arrival in the UK.

What is the Immigration Health Surcharge?

In order to study in the UK for six months or longer you will need to pay an Immigration Health Surcharge (IHS) so you can access any National Health (NHS) services. This only applies if you require a Tier 4 General Student Visa. For further information please visit the links to the right.

Travelling to Leeds

Once you have arranged your fees, visa and accommodation you will be ready to travel to Leeds. Below we have provided some information about the best UK airports to book, key dates for your diary and the documents you should remember to bring with you.

Flying to Leeds

The best airports to fly to are Leeds Bradford and Manchester. If you are unable to arrive at these two airports we recommend you fly to one of the London airports of Heathrow or Gatwick

Leeds Bradford Airport is the closest airport to Leeds Beckett University. From this airport you can take a taxi to your accommodation, which should cost you approximately £25.

Manchester Airport is about 40 miles from Leeds. From there you could take a train to Leeds for approximately £10-25 (depending on how early you book) or a coach for about £15. Both the train and coach station are located within the airport building. A taxi from Manchester will cost approximately £80. A train will take you to Leeds train station and a coach to Leeds coach station. A taxi to your accommodation will cost about £10.

London Heathrow Airport is a six hour coach journey to Leeds and will cost approximately £20-40 depending on how early you book your ticket. The coach is a direct journey to Leeds. If you take the train you will need to change trains in the centre of London, which could be difficult with all your luggage. When you arrive in Leeds you can take a taxi from the coach station to your accommodation; this will cost approximately £10.

London Gatwick Airport is a seven hour journey by coach to Leeds and costs approximately £40. The same applies to the train journey from London Heathrow - you will need to change trains in the centre of London.

We can meet you at Leeds Bradford Airport or Manchester Airport. Find out more on page 11.

What to pack in your hand luggage

All important documents should be carried with you in your hand luggage. Before you travel make sure you have the following documents on you:

- Your arrival information
- Your passport
- Visa
- Sponsorship letter (if applicable)
- Proof of fees paid
- Proof of funds to support yourself in the UK (if you are travelling from outside the EU and EEA)
- Marriage and birth certificates if you are travelling with your family
- Copy of your accommodation address and contact phone number

If the immigration officer grants you temporary admission only please contact the International Student Advisor as soon as possible.

Meet and Greet Service

It can feel a little daunting leaving your home to study in another country. To help you feel welcome we provide a Meet and Greet service where one of our students meet you on arrival. This takes place between 16 to 22 January and we have provided the exact times and dates below.

Which airports do you provide meet and greet?

We run our Meet and Greet service at Leeds Bradford and Manchester airports. When you arrive one of our students will help you find the best transport for the final part of your journey to your accommodation. They will also try to answer any questions you may have.

We run meet and greet on following dates and times:

Leeds Bradford International Airport, 16 to 22 January 2017 between 09:00 and 21:00.

Manchester Airport, Friday 20 January 2017 between 09:00 and 18:00.

Leeds: we will meet you as you come through the arrivals hall and show you to the taxi rank where you can book and pay for your taxi to your accommodation; this will cost around £25.

Manchester: we only offer a meet and greet service for one day at Manchester airport. We will be providing a free bus service back to Leeds city centre. Buses will depart at 10:00, 14:00 and 18:00. When you arrive in Leeds we can book you a free taxi to your accommodation.

How will I recognise Meet and Greet students?

Our students will be wearing Leeds Beckett International Student Ambassador tops and holding a sign for Leeds Beckett Meet and Greet.

How much does Meet and Creet cost?

There is no cost in using our Meet and Greet service. However, you will need to make sure you have enough money to pay for your taxi, train or bus service from the airport to your accommodation, (unless you are arriving at Manchester on 20 January or Leeds Bradford on 21 January, when transport will be free).

Our students will be happy to book a taxi for you or take you to the nearest train station or bus service to Leeds

How can I book onto Meet and Creet?

It is important you book at least three days before you arrive in the UK. You will need to book by emailing us with the information listed below. Once we have received your email we will send you confirmation of who will be meeting you at either Leeds Bradford or Manchester airport. We will give you a number to contact us on if your plane is delayed.




